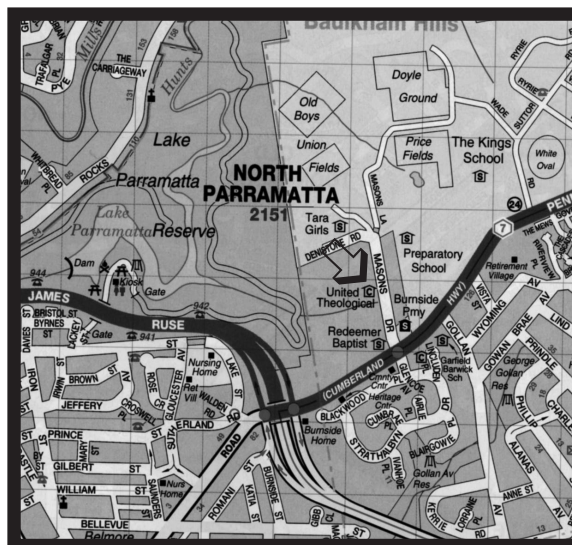

## PROFESSOR DAVID ORSMOND

David is Professor of Economics, Macquarie Business School and Director of Policy and Communications, Centre for Applied Artificial Intelligence at Macquarie University. He previously worked at the Reserve Bank of Australia, holding senior positions in the Financial Stability and Economic Analysis Departments. Dr Orsmond also spent an extended period at the International Monetary Fund (IMF), working on economic stabilisation and technical assistance issues across numerous countries, and earlier at the Department of Prime Minister and Cabinet. He has written on a range of topics, including the emergence of artificial intelligence, regulatory policies in the financial sector, China's economy and the mining sector. He holds a PhD from Duke University, a Bachelor of Economics (Hons) from the University of Sydney and completed studies in economic policy at the Kiel Institute for the World Economy in Germany.
